HAY – GRAIN

1. Quart glass jars with lids are to be used to exhibit grain in classes 9 through 26.
2. If the fair management believes that any of the exhibits were shown in previous years, these entries may be refused.
3. Only one item may be entered per class.
4. **Entry forms must be submitted to Diane Mott, 300 Grimms Road #1, Honesdale, PA 18431 by July 1, 2017. There is an entry fee of \$2.00 per person – this must accompany your entry form. Please make checks payable to Wayne County Fair.**

****REMINDER**** Entry day now takes place on **Wednesday** (August 2) from 1pm – 7pm. Judging will be done on Thursday. **

Entry tags can be picked up on Monday, July 24th from 4pm-6pm, please indicate on your entry form if you wish to pick up your tags or have them mailed. Any tags not picked up that day will be mailed (those indicating they would like their tags mailed will have them mailed prior to or on pick up day)

Section 1 Corn & Grain

Premiums for class #1-8 are as follows.

Section 2 Hay

1. Long hay only. An exhibit should consist of a bale section at least 8 inches thick or an equivalent amount if cut from hay in the mow.

Class

1. **Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed – first cutting.** Not more than 50% of grasses
2. **Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed – later cutting.** Not more than 50% of grasses
3. **Other legumes or legume grass mixture.** Not more than 50% of grasses
4. **Grass – first cutting.** Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses and containing more than 10% legumes
5. **Grass – second cutting.** Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses and containing more than 10% legumes
6. **Mixed Hay** – any mixture not classified in the previous classes, but which contain 50% or more singly or in combination of alfalfa, timothy, clover, and grasses
7. **Summer annual grasses** – Sudan Grass, Sorghum-Sudan, hybrids, etc.

Section 3 Silage

1. Silage crop must be named. Exhibits will consist of five pounds placed in two gallon zip lock bags.

Class

1. Perennial Crops – direct cut, with or without preservatives
2. Perennial Crops – wilted or low moisture, with or without preservatives
3. Annuals other than Corn – direct cut with or without preservatives
4. Annuals other than Corn – wilted or low moisture, with or without preservatives
5. Corn Silage
