

## DEPARTMENT 17

### FLORAL EXHIBITS

1. The use of or displaying of artificial flowers is prohibited and no premiums will be paid.
2. Plants positively will not be accepted for exhibition unless they've been growing in containers for two months.
3. The management will not undertake to return exhibits or be responsible for the return of exhibits. Baskets or containers must be supplied by the exhibitor and will be given every possible care, but the management assumes no responsibility for their safety.
4. Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.
5. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor except in Section 5, Class #1 (Wildflower Arrangement).
6. Only one item may be entered per class.
7. **Entry forms must be submitted to Diane Mott, 300 Grimms Road #1, Honesdale PA 18431 by July 1, 2017. There is an entry fee of \$2.00 per person – this must accompany your entry form. Please make checks payable to Wayne County Fair.**

**\*\*REMINDER\*\*** Entry day now takes place on **Wednesday** (August 2) from 1pm – 7pm. Judging will be done on Thursday. **\*\***

Entry tags can be picked up on Monday, July 24<sup>th</sup> from 4pm-6pm, please indicate on your entry form if you wish to pick up your tags or have them mailed. Any tags not picked up that day will be mailed (those indicating they would like their tags mailed will have them mailed prior to or on pick up day)

1. Exhibits in this section must be cut flowers grown by the exhibitor and must conform to the number of blooms, spikes, or stems specified for each class.
2. The uniformity of height, color, or size is an important factor in evaluating entries.
3. Flowers in each entry must be of one color and variety unless otherwise specified.

**Premiums for all classes in this section are as follows.**

**1<sup>st</sup> - \$2.00    2<sup>nd</sup> - \$1.75    3<sup>rd</sup> - \$1.50    4<sup>th</sup> - \$1.25**

## **SECTION 4** **SPECIMEN FLOWERS – PERENNIALS**

1. Exhibits in this section must be cut flowers, grown by the exhibitor and must conform to the number of blooms, spikes, or stems specified in each class.

2. The uniformity of height, color, or size is an important factor in evaluating entries.
3. Flowers in each entry must be of one color and variety unless otherwise specified.

**Premiums for all classes in this section are as follows.**

**1<sup>st</sup> - \$2.00    2<sup>nd</sup> - \$1.75    3<sup>rd</sup> - \$1.50    4<sup>th</sup> - \$1.25**

1. Shasta Daisy, 5 stems
2. Rose, floribunda, 1 stem

3. Chrysanthemums – Single or Daisy Type – 5 stems
4. Chrysanthemums – Spider or Japanese – 5 stems
5. Clematis, 1 bloom

## **SECTION 5 ARRANGEMENTS**

1. Maximum care will be taken of the containers and accessories until they can be reclaimed by exhibitors, but the fair cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss.
2. No artificial flowers may be used.
3. No professionals may enter
4. Flowers must be grown by exhibitor except in class #1.

**Premiums for all classes in this section are as follows.**

**1<sup>st</sup> - \$5.00    2<sup>nd</sup> - \$4.00    3<sup>rd</sup> - \$3.00    4<sup>th</sup> - \$2.00**

1. Arrangement of Wild Flowers – no plants forbidden by conservation rules should be used.
2. Arrangement of Flowers that are one color (not white); foliage permitted
3. Arrangement using a pedestal container
4. Fruit and/or Vegetable Arrangement with or without flowers or foliage

5. Arrangement featuring a Candle
6. Arrangement in a Bottle
7. Arrangement using One Flower only; foliage and/or accessories may be used.
8. Arrangement depicting a Holiday or Special Occasion
9. All White Arrangement – foliage permitted
10. Arrangement of Foliage – no flowers
11. Nosegays – small arrangement not to exceed 5” in height
12. Table Arrangement
13. Arrangement in a Basket
14. Arrangement in a Teapot/Tea Kettle
15. Arrangement in a Watering Can
