### FRUITS, BERRIES & NUTS

1. In selecting fruits for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do NOT select the largest. Select **medium** size specimen. In plate displays, select five specimens as nearly alike as possible.
2. All entries must be named as to their variety.
3. All fruits are to be clean, but not polished.
4. **Entries of fruit are to consist of 5 specimen; berries – 1 pint; nuts – 10 specimen; and grapes – 2 clusters, unless otherwise specified.**
5. Only one item may be entered per class.
6. **Entry forms must be submitted to Diane Mott, 300 Grimms Road #1, Honesdale, PA 18431 by July 1, 2018. There is an entry fee of \$2.00 per person – this must accompany your entry form. Please make checks payable to Wayne County Fair.**

**\*\*REMINDER\*\*** Entry day now takes place on **Wednesday** (August 1) from 1pm – 7pm. Judging will be done on Thursday. **\*\***

Entry tags can be picked up on Monday, July 23rd from 4pm-6pm, please indicate on your entry form if you wish to pick up your tags or have them mailed. Any tags not picked up that day will be mailed (those indicating they would like their tags mailed will have them mailed prior to or on pick up day)
