3. Only one item may be entered per class.
4. **Entry forms must be submitted to Wayne County Fair, 270 Miller Drive, Honesdale PA 18431, by July 1, 2023. There is an entry fee of \$2.00 per person — this must accompany your entry form. Please make checks payable to Wayne County Fair.**
