- 1. When in exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under show halter (not rope) and in charge of by the owner or owner's representative.
- 2. Beef cattle shall be restrained in their assigned stalls using **<u>both</u>** a neck tie (not baler twine) and a halter when animals are not being physically handled (i.e. walking to wash rack, fitting in a chute, during show)
- 3. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions must be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 4. When on exhibition in the ring Junior people showing the fair shall have men available for assistance.
- 5. Health certificates are required.
- 6. **Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals, DO NOT USE IT!! **Important** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.**
- 7. Exhibitors must have all animals listed for competition on the grounds between **12 Noon and 6:00 PM, Thursday, August 3, 2023.** Open beef animals are released at **9:30 PM on Sunday, August 6, 2023.**
- 8. Entry forms must be submitted by July 1, 2023 to the Wayne County Fair Office 270 Miller Drive, Honesdale PA 18431.There is an entry fee of \$1.00 per animal.
- 9. Breeding stock must be registered to show in a breed.
- 10. Breeds that are not designated with a class fall under the classification of "All Other Breeds"
- 11. Exhibitors limited to two premium awards per class.
- 12. Limited to one entry in group classes.
- 13. All cattle **must** be properly dehorned by check-in.
- 14. Please check "Health Rules" section of this premium book for all health rules and regulations.
- 15. Animals shown in breeding classes may not also be shown in feeder classes.

16. Cows shown in the cow shown with calf class are to be currently lactating and the calf shown at side cannot be older than 250 days old. Calf is eligible to compete in individual calf classes but must be entered in the appropriate class.

Keeping aisles clean	15 points
Courtesy to people	15 points
TOTAL	100 points
